
Folsom Lake at near Dead Pool





January 2014 Snow Survey Echo Summit




Northern Sierra Precipitation: 8-Station Index, July 25, 2014




Total Water Year Precipitation

Reservoir Conditions - Lake Oroville








Data Updated 07/25/2014 08:15 AM

Graph Updated 07/25/2014 08:15 AM





SWRCB Resolution 2014-0038 an Emergency Regulation

- Promote water conservation, prevent waste
- In effect after three dry years
- Funding contingent on compliance (grants and loans)

- 500\$ fine for wasting potable water :
 - Irrigation Runoff
 - Washing pavement
 - Hoses without shut off nozzles
 - Single pass water features
- \$10,000 fine to water suppliers that do not enforce the regulation

Dept. Pesticide Regulation CE Hours

- 3 hours of "Other"
- Avoid Irrigation runoff and keep pesticides out of the waterways
