

### A 4 question survey given to 52 Non-Profit Tree Organizations

Have you considered submitting your tree planting project for future carbon offset credit?

- 5 groups said yes
- 12 groups said no



## Reasons for not Submitting Tree Planting Carbon Offset Project

- High monitoring, verification & transaction costs
- Lack of information
- One hundred year permanence requirement
- Eligibility requirements that exclude land developers and NGOs.

### What's needed?

- "...Need streamlined-method ..."
- Need money..."to learn how..."
- Need "partnership with our city..." for funds
- Need to "know enough about the process to ... get started."

## **Annual Budget**

- 7 organizations < \$100K</p>
- **4** \$101K \$500K
- **2** \$500K \$1M
- **3** \$1M \$2M
- 1 >\$5M





## **Major Obstacle**

- Monitoring Costs the expense of the contracted out service.
- <u>Perception:</u> This expense reduces trees that could be planted by simple corporate sponsorship of tree plantings.











### **Further Questions**

- Is there a true benefit for the urban forest?
- Are the certifiers draining too much of the potential funds?
- Does the financial benefit outweigh the cost and staff time for the organization?

# Possible Solutions to Implementing a Carbon Offset Project

- <u>Partner</u> with multiple public and private groups to diversify the funding and clarify the 'benefits package' tree plantings provide:
  - Public Utility Commission Water & Sewer
  - Public Works Department Public Infrastructure
  - Local Health Care Institutions Improved Mental and Physical Health
  - Air Quality Management Districts Improved Health
  - Local University Environmental Programs Education and Project Assistance
