# Adoptions by City (279)

- 46 Cities formally adopted Model Ordinance
- 158 Cities Adopted a local ordinance
- 75 using the MO in the interim while writing a local ordinance
- 481 cities in CA==about 200 have not responded yet





# Adoptions by County (32)

- 10 Counties adopted the Model Ordinance
- 12 Counties adopted a local ordinance
- 10 using the MO in the interim
- 58 counties==26 have not responded yet



# Adoption by Water Purveyors

 6 + water purveyors have adopted a new landscape ordinance

Not required by statute



## **DWR Report to Legislature**

- Due by 1/31/2011
- Summarizes the status of adoption by local agencies



# Cal Green-January 2011

- Non-Residential
  - Mandatory
    - MO as baseline (water budget and provisions)
    - Dedicated sub-metering at 1000 sq.ft
  - Voluntary measures
    - Tier 1 Water Budget at 60% of local ETo
    - Tier 2 Water Budget at 55% of local ETo
    - Potable water reduction by 50%



### Cal Green-2011

#### Residential

- Mandatory
  - Irrigation controllers that use weather based or soil moisture based sensing technology
  - Rain shutoff sensors
- Voluntary
  - Tier 1 Water Budget at 65% of local ETo
  - Tier 2 Water Budget at 60% of local ETo
