City of Petaluma, California Summary of Water and Wastewater (Sewer) Rates Effective January 1, 2013 and July 1, 2013 (Water Consumption Charge)

The City of Petaluma bills for water and wastewater (sewer) services on a monthly basis. Both of these services are included in your monthly water bill. The following is a summary of the service charges:

# Section 1.0 Water Rates

Water bills include a fixed monthly service charge and consumption charge. The fixed monthly service charge is driven by costs independent of water consumption and is based on the meter size. Most residential meters are a 5/8" meter. Expenditures that influence this charge include system replacement costs, service and main line maintenance, and administrative costs. Consumption charges for multi-unit residential, commercial and industrial customers are based on a single rate. The consumption charge for single-family residential customers is based on four tiers. The average single-family household will see some usage in the second tier. Typical water consumption for a singlefamily residential customer is about 12 hundred cubic feet (hcf) per month, or 8,976 gallons. Please note that 1 hcf = 748 gallons.

The average household in Petaluma uses approximately 8 hcf (5,984 gallons) of water per month during the winter months.

# 2.3 Example Single Family Residential Wastewater Charge

All wastewater customers are charged a flat service charge plus a commodity charge. The commodity charge for residential customers is based on the amount of water used during the winter months or actual water usage, whichever is lower. The winter water usage billing method is designed to more fairly distribute the costs of operating the wastewater system. Water consumed during the winter months of the year approximates wastewater (sewage) flow. This is because landscape irrigation should be minimal, and therefore most, if not all, water consumed during this period is returned to the wastewater (sewer) system. This approach also rewards water conservation. New customers without consumption history are assigned an average wintertime usage average of 8 unitsuntil there is sufficient consumption history to compute the average.

For this example, the monthly wastewater charges for a single family with a monthly average of 8 units is:

Winter water averages are updated in July, using the average winter water usage from the previous winter.

# Water Waste Ordinance 713

Water is coming under increasing Federal regulations, especially as it relates to fisheries. These regulations put pressure on cities, such as Rohnert Park to conserve water, as that helps protect local fish habitats. Water meters have proven to be one effective tool to promote water conservation. Further, by metering water usage, the City can accurately and with good reason bill residents for their usage and reward customers who conserve water. The City of Rohnert Park's water resource provided through our well system and the Sonoma County Water Agency water supply, primarily from Lake Sonoma. Since 1956, Rohnert Park has relied on a system of wells supplemented by one million gallons of county aqueduct water a day to meet its water needs. Rohnert Park's well system is becoming more expensive to operate, and our growing population is taxing it. As a result, Rohnert Park has increased its draw from the county aqueduct to 15 million gallons a day. We will continue to use some well water, but in the near future, most of our water will come from the county aqueduct.

Single family residential accounts with no sewer cap due to an absence of irrigation usage and single family residential accounts that are water-only accounts, which do not use City water to irrigate, will have all water billed at the Tier 1 user charge.

Single family residential water-only accounts (i.e. those with no corresponding City wastewater account), and which use City water for irrigation, will be allotted a water cap for purposes of being billed at the tiered rates.

# **Dedicated Irrigation Accounts**

Dedicated irrigation accounts are accounts that have a meter used solely for irrigation. These accounts shall have a user charge based on site-specific water budgets.

The billing period water budget is the amount of water needed to irrigate the specific area of landscape served by the dedicated irrigation account for the specific days covered by the billing period. The billing period water budget is determined monthly in arrears for each account in accordance with the following formula:

 $ET_o$  (Reference Evapotranspiration) = Evapotranspiration is defined as the amount of water used by the plants (transpiration) and evaporated from the soil (evaporation). It is measured in inches by the Santa Rosa California Irrigation Management Information Systems (CIMIS) weather stations. Reference Evaportranspiration is a standard measurement of evapotranspiration for cool-season turf. The Billing Period  $ET_{\underline{o}}$  is the sum of the daily  $ET_{\underline{o}}$  for the specific days of the billing cycle.

EP (Effective Precipitation) = The depth of rainfall, measured in inches by the Santa Rosa CIMIS weather stations, that offsets  $ET_o$ . It is assumed that only 1/3 of total rainfall offsets  $ET_o$ . The Billing Period effective precipitation is for the specific days of the billing cycle.

 $LA_h$  (landscape area high) = Square footage of site's landscape area consisting of high water use plants or uses (turfgrass, ornamental water features, annuals, plants in containers and plants with a plant factor greater than 0.6)

 $LA_m$  (landscape area moderate) = Square footage of site's landscape area consisting of moderate and low water use plants (plants with a plant factor of 0.6 or less) CF (Conversion factor) = 0.623, the number that converts square feet to gallons

Verifications of the connection site's landscape measurements may be requested by the customer. Adjustments to the landscape measurements may be made if changes, including but not limited to addition of landscape, changes to the plant type, or removal of landscape, are made to the connection site's landscape, however the adjustments cannot exceed the acceptable landscape

plant mix as defined by the City's Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (Chapter 14-30). To request a verification or adjustment for the connection site, contact the Utilities Department.

Section 3. The Council, based on the reports, oral and written, of staff, the recommendations of the Board of Public Utilities, the other materials provided and considered, and the testimony and other evidence presented, finds that the changes in service rates and charges set forth above are not discriminatory or excessive, are sufficient under Section 54515 of the Government Code, and are required to meet estimated costs and operating expenses, including increased employee wages and fringe benefits, the cost of purchasing and/or leasing supplies, materials and equipment, financial reserve requirements and the costs of capital improvements, necessary to maintain and provide proper and adequate service to properties and premises served by the City's water utility, an enterprise system. Based on these findings, the City Council finds that the changes in rates and charges set forth in this ordinance are exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act under section 15273 of the State CEQA Guidelines.

Section 4. Delinquent water service charges and all penalties thereon when recorded as provided in Chapter 14-04 of the Santa Rosa City Code and Chapter 6 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code shall constitute a lien upon the real property served.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be effective following its adoption and publication, provided, however, that the water charges and rates set forth in Sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance shall be applied only to billings on water meters read by the City's Board of Public Utilities on and after January 14, 2012 and January 1, 2013, as set forth in the above amended sections 14-04.090 and 14-08.010 of the City Code and provided, further, that the water rates and charges in effect on the adoption date of this ordinance shall be applied to all billings on water meters read prior to January 14, 2012.
